POST-SECONDARY PROGRAMS

Southeast College offers a wide range of post secondary programming options. From first year University courses, to Technical and Trades programming, we provide students with opportunities to further their education through both face-to-face and distance learning options.

Business Diploma in Management

Business encompasses many disciplines. The Business Diploma program prepares you for a wide variety of positions. The program provides a solid foundation of the major business concepts and principles for careers in accounting, marketing, management, human resources, insurance, finance and entrepreneurship.

Graduates from the Business Diploma program may find employment in banking, retail, human resources, insurance, marketing more. Entry-level positions include and management trainees, administrative assistants, financial officers and sales representatives.

Admission Requirements

- Grade 12 or successful completion of three (3) courses of at least 3 credit units each from this Business certificate program or the Business diploma (Year 1) program.

Practical Nursing Diploma

In just two years, we'll help you develop into a competent, confident nurse capable of making a positive difference in the health and well-being of individuals, their families, and our communities. Onsite labs and community-based clinical experiences let you apply nursing knowledge, theory, and skills in a variety of environments. Our experienced faculty help you grow into a competent, confident nurse capable of bringing a holistic, humanistic approach to patient care.

Admission Requirements

- Grade 12 with a minimum overall average of 65% in the following five subjects: English Language Arts A30

- English Language Arts B30 Foundations of Math 30 OR Pre-calculus 30 OR Workplace and Apprenticeship Math 30 (Previous Saskatcheval and mathematics Apprenticeship Math 30 (Previous Saskatchewan mathematics requirement also accepted: Math A30, Math B30, Math C30, Calculus 30, or General Math 30)
 o One of Biology 30, Chemistry 30 or Physics 30
 o One of Social Studies 30, History 30 or Native Studies 30 English Language Requirement

Practicums provide direct experience in home care, long-term care, special care and acute care settings.

Primary Care Paramedic Certificate - Part Time

Being a paramedic is all about teamwork. There's a sense of camaraderie you won't find in many other jobs. But it takes a special kind of person. You have to want to help people because you'll be attending to people of all ages in all kinds of crises. You have to work well under pressure because you'll be delivering pre-hospital emergency care in people's homes, in the middle of busy streets, and/or at industrial sites. Our program emphasizes authentic hands-on training in prehospital emergency care, with both hospital and ambulance practicums.

Admission Requirements

- Grade 12 with a minimum overall average of 60% in the following four courses: English Language Arts A30, English Language Arts B30, one of Biology 30 or Chemistry 30, and one of Workplace and Apprenticeship Math 30 or Foundations of Math 30 or Pre-Calculus 30. (Previous Saskatchewan mathematics Math A30 will also be accepted).
- English Language Requirement
- Standard First Aid/CPR C/AED is required prior to the start of the program and must be current to the year of the program.

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NEW Early Admission for **Bachelor of Science in Nursing**

University of Saskatchewan **Bachelor of Nursing -Pre Professional Year 1**

At Southeast College, we offer the opportunity to complete the Bachelor of Nursing pre-professional year at our Weyburn Campus. For the pre-professional year, students will need to apply through the University of Saskatchewan's College of Arts and Science and complete the 30 credit units of courses required for year 1 of the degree program. Students completing the preprofessional year can apply to USask Nursing to continue towards the full nursing degree at a number of sites across the province, including Southeast College Weyburn Campus. For any pre-professional students who do not pursue Nursing, the Arts and Science credits can be used towards a number of other degree programs at USask in Saskatoon, Prince Albert or various online options. Please speak with an advisor.

The pre-professional year of study at a post-secondary level provides a solid foundation in university education, preparation for upper-year nursing classes and transferable credits to other health science degrees.

NEW for 2024/2025, the University of Saskatchewan (USask) College of Nursing is offering early admission for the fall 2025 Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) intake. These early admission seats are available across the province at all campuses and distributed sites, including Southeast College Weyburn Campus. Early admission will use the same eligibility and selection criteria as regular admission to the BSN program, spots will be competitive, and students must apply to USask by December 15, 2024. If a student chooses not to apply for early admission, the regular admission deadline of March 31, 2025 still applies. For more information, please visit USask Admissions.



High School Prerequisites

To enroll in courses required in the pre-professional year, students must have completed high school with credit in the following courses:

- English A30 and B30
- Biology 30
- Chemistry 30 (recommended) and
- Foundations of Math 30; or Pre-Calculus 30 or Math B30 or Math C30 (recommended)





Powerline Technician

Since 2020, Southeast College has been the trainer for the Powerline Technician Apprenticeship program (Levels one through four) within the province of Saskatchewan. Individuals working in this trade construct and maintain overhead and underground power lines and related equipment.

Powerline Technicians:

Install, maintain, troubleshoot, and repair electrical distribution and transmission systems. Erect and maintain steel, wood or concrete poles, towers, and guy wires. Splice, solder, and insulate conductors and related wiring to connect power distribution and transmission networks using related electrical tools. Inspect and test overhead and underground power lines and cables and associated equipment. Climb ladders or operate hydraulic buckets when working aloft on poles and towers, or work in confined spaces such as trenches and tunnels to install power lines and cables and associated equipment.

Welding Applied Certificate

Do you want to prepare yourself for a career in welding?

This 20-week enhanced program is based on Level 1 Apprenticeship Training. As a graduate and after you become an apprentice, you can apply to the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Commission for credit for Level 1 Welding training.

Southeast College will be delivering the Welding Applied Certificate program in a blended delivery format (a complimentary mix of both virtual and in class instruction). Students will need to have access to a computer and internet. Please contact us at 1-866-999-7372 for more information

Plumbing and Pipefitting Applied Certificate

Fast track your career in the skilled trades with Southeast College's 16-week applied certificate program. Plumbers install, replace and maintain water and sewage systems in residential, commercial and industrial buildings. Many are also licensed gas fitters.

The Plumbing and Pipefitting program provides the knowledge and skills you need for an entry level job. Your learning is practical and hands-on – and includes a two-week job placement that lets you test your skills in the real world.

Electrician Applied Certificate

This course provides the basic knowledge and skills you need for an entry level electrician job. Industry experienced instructors will help you learn how to install, test, replace and repair lighting fixtures, wiring and electrical equipment. You'll get lots of hands-on practice using standard tools of the trade. You'll also learn how to read and interpret construction drawings. Electrician is a skilled trade. Having an applied certificate will get you noticed by employers and put you on the fast track to having a career as an electrician. The more education and experience you get, the higher you can climb on the wage-earning ladder. Graduates of this program may find employment with electrical contractors (both commercial and residential), large manufacturing and mining firms, retail outlets, or wholesale outlets.

Heavy Equipment Truck & Transport Technician Certificate

The 36-week Heavy Equipment & Truck & Transport Technician Certificate program gives you basic training in two high-demand mechanical trades at the same time. Heavy Duty equipment technicians work on large mobile equipment – bulldozers, cranes, graders, loaders, & earthmovers used in construction, mining, forestry, & more. Truck & Transport mechanics work on trucks, buses, & highway transport vehicles for dealers, garages & transportation companies. Trade time and academic credit may be available for graduates who find employment in the trade and register as apprentices. Industrial Mechanic Applied Certificate

This 16-week program gives you a working knowledge of machinery common to most industries and an introduction to preventative maintenance procedures. This program covers all level 1 subjects and is recognized by the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission (SATCC). Work experience of 2 weeks is part of the program. Industrial mechanics are also known by other trade names (maintenance mechanics, millwrights or machine repairmen).

Graduates may find employment in commercial or industrial operations that use machinery. These include wood, cereal, meat processing and power generating plants, hard rock and potash mines, mills, and refineries.

Trade time and academic credit may be available for graduates who find employment in the trade and register as apprentices. Please contact the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission for further information.
