APPLICATION PROCESS



International Students

Step 1:

Complete the online application for your chosen program. For a complete list of programs, please visit www.southeastcollege.org/international-students/

Step 2:

Meet Admission Requirements and Submit Transcripts/English Language Proficiency Testing Results. You must review and understand the admission requirements for the program(s) you are applying for. Transcripts and supporting documents can be submitted by email to international@southeastcollege.org. When you apply using our online application, you will automatically be redirected to the Flywire payment site to complete the payment transaction.

The application fee is \$140 CAD.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Step 3: Offer Letter

If you meet the academic and English language requirements, **you will receive an Offer Letter from Southeast College.** This letter will set a deadline for payment of the tuition deposit, which is equivalent to 50% of the program tuition and mandatory fees. **Once the tuition deposit is paid, an official receipt and a Letter of Acceptance will be issued.** If you have questions about the admissions process please contact us at international@southeastcollege.org

Step 4: Study Permit

An international student in Canada must possess proper legal documents to study in Canada in accordance with the Canada Immigration Act. For more information regarding studying in Canada, a Study Permit, and a Temporary Resident Visa, please check the Immigration, Refugees, and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) web page. Some programs have a mandatory work component. Please check your Letter of Acceptance carefully. If you are in one of these programs, please apply for a Co-op Work Permit at the same time you apply for your Canadian Study Permit.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

At Southeast College, English is the language of instruction and examination. All international students must provide evidence of competent English language skills to enroll in a Southeast College program.

Unless otherwise indicated by program-specific English requirements, international students must demonstrate evidence of their English language skills in one of the following ways:

International English Language Testing System (IELTS)

- Overall minimum score of Band 6.5 with a minimum score of 5.0 in each component. Test result must be within two years.

Duolingo English Test (DET)

- A minimum overall score of 105. Result must be submitted directly to Southeast College.

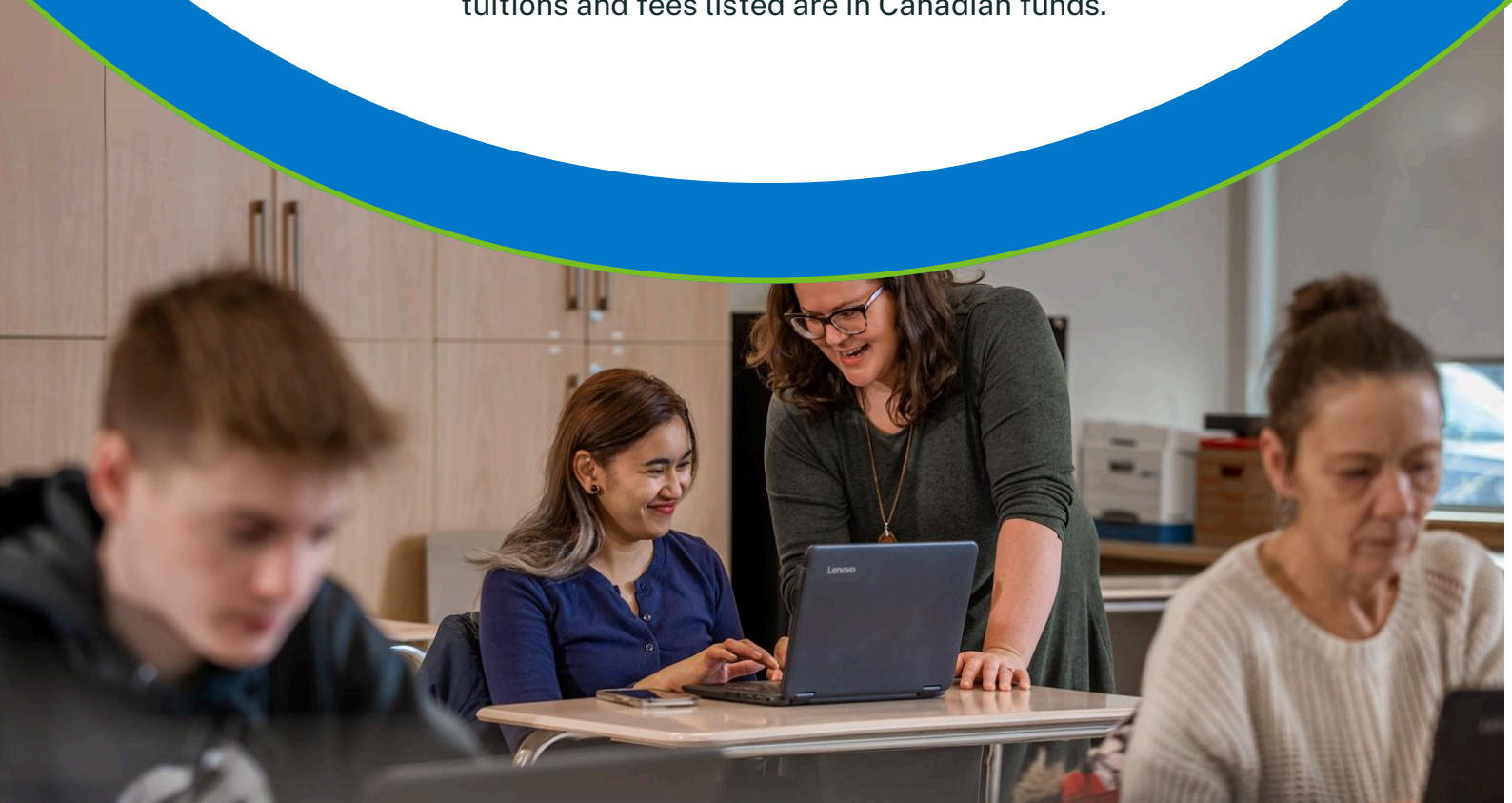

Climate

Autumn begins in mid-September with warm, sunny days that give way to cool, crisp nights with huge harvest moons. When winter begins in mid-November, the days are generally sunny, the snow dry and powdery. Temperatures range between highs of 0 degrees C during the day to lows of -24 degrees C during the night (on average). Spring explodes with new growth around mid-March with temperatures ranging from -13 to +15 degrees C. Summer is hot, with sunny days and warm nights. Parks, beaches and backyards are full. The warmest months of July and August range from +15 at night to +25 degrees C during the day.

OUR CAMPUSES

ESTEVAN

Estevan, the closest city to the United States border of the prairie provinces, is located in the southeast corner of the province nestled along the Souris River. Estevan is 201km away from Regina, about 2 hours by car transportation. As of the 2016 census, city had a population of 13,615. Estevan is known as a mining, oil and power generating city with a very strong entrepreneurial spirit. Estevan is home to a number of excellent recreational and educational facilities and great pride is taken in ensuring a positive community growth agenda, making Estevan a great place to live, work and do business. Take in the boutique stores of downtown or the "must see" rocks of Roche Percee.

WEYBURN

Weyburn is 115km km away from Regina, about 1 hour by car transportation. Referred to as "The Opportunity City" in 2019, Weyburn was ranked as Best Place to Live in the Prairies and 45th overall in Canada by Maclean's Magazine. Weyburn's vibrant economy has created opportunities for people from all over the world to visit, live, study and do business. As of the 2016 census, city had a population of 10,870. As one of the fastest growing communities in Saskatchewan, Weyburn is recognized as one of the more desirable places to live and work. Weyburn is a dynamic community with a long history of dedication to providing an exceptional quality of life for residents.

ASSINIBOIA

The peaceful community of Assiniboia invites visitors to the heart of the golden south. Located 110 KM southwest of Moose Jaw and 176km from Regina, about 2 hours by car transportation. Assiniboia is rich with heritage, resources and a strong sense of community. The community boasts a number of arts and cultural events, community wellness initiatives and a wide range of recreational facilities. As of the 2016 census, the town had a population of 2,389.

WHITEWOOD

Whitewood is located approximately 175 KM east of Regina along the TransCanada Highway, about 2 hours away by car transportation. Whitewood is known as the Crossroads community because of its location at the corner of two major highways. Whitewood is home to walking trails, a community center, campground, dog park, swimming pool and many other community services. In the 2021 Census of Population, Whitewood had a population of 944.
