BASIC RIGGING (SOUTHEAST COLLEGE) - 1/2 DAY

Introduces the student to load weights, angles, stresses and center of gravity. The student will learn about sling hitches and sling types, rigging hardware and lifting devices. The methods of communication and recognized hand signals will also be taught.

CONFINED SPACE (SOUTHEAST COLLEGE) - 1 DAY

This course covers the O H & S regulations pertaining to confined spaces, hazard identification, gas detection, and the entry permit. It also covers the inspection and use of SCBA and rescue techniques and simulation, and reinforces the need for proper pre-planning procedures.

Recertification every 3 years.

DETECTION AND CONTROL OF FLAMMABLE SUBSTANCES (ENERGY SAFETY CANADA) - 1 DAY

This course is designed for personnel working with or near flammable substances in the oil and gas industry. The primary focus is to safely monitor and control these substances. The course includes an introduction to flammable substances, principles of flammable gas/ vapour detection, care and preparation of combustible gas monitors, interpreting combustible gas readings, and control methods.

Recertification every 3 years.

FALL ARREST (SOUTHEAST COLLEGE) - 1/2 DAY

This course covers the O H & S Act & Regulations required to meet fall arrest requirements. The course also covers care and maintenance of full body harnesses and anchor points. Practical training included.

Recertification every 3 years.

FALL PROTECTION FOR RIG WORKERS (ENERGY SAFETY CANADA) - 2 DAYS

Fall Protection was developed in conjunction with the Canadian Association of Oilwell Drilling Contractors (CAOCD) and is intended for workers, supervisors, managers and safety personnel involved in drilling and service rig operations. This two-day Energy Safety Canada course includes fall protection principles, anchorages, body support devices, connecting components and devices, life lines and ladder-climbing systems. The hands-on portion of the training includes climbing to heights using fall protection equipment, work positioning, anchorage connection and transfer between fall protection systems. Successful completion of the course requires that participants be able to climb to a height of approximately four meters.

Recertification every 3 years.

FALL RESCUE FOR RIG WORKERS (ENERGY SAFETY CANADA) - 1 DAY

Fall Rescue was developed in conjunction with the Canadian Association of Oilwell Drilling Contractors (CAODC), and is intended for workers, supervisors, managers and safety personnel. Topics covered include rescue team roles, rescue equipment, ropes and knots, mechanical advantage, management of escape buggy, and rescue scenarios.

Recertification every 3 years.

FIRE EXTINGUISHER SIMULATOR

This course combines the Southeast College Fire Extinguisher theoryonly course with a hands-on component utilizing a simulator. Students are given approximately 2 hours of theory in the classroom. Students are given an overview of fire extinguishers, the different types of extinguisher and which type of extinguisher to use with different types of fire. The remainder of the time is spent hands-on with the simulator. The simulator uses propane to create a very realistic fire in a controlled environment. Students are given air charged extinguishers using water to put out the fire on the simulator. The simulator can be changed to simulate a motor fire, kitchen stove fire, etc. The instructor is in full control of the flame and can extinguish it at any time. Each student will need approximately 20 minutes of practical time, plus observation.

FIREMAN'S PAPERS PREP COURSE (SOUTHEAST COLLEGE) - 5 DAYS

This course is intended to assist candidates in their preparation for writing a provincial Fireman's papers exam.

First Aid/CPR/AED

This standard First Aid & CPR is a two day course that covers artificial resuscitation, choking, bleeding, shock, wounds and dressings, injuries, burns, fractures plus much more. Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Training is included. Receive a certificate from an authorized provider. Course content set by Occupational Health and Safety. Topics include emergency scene management, choking, shock and unconsciousness, severe bleeding, one and two rescuer CPR for an adult casualty, and automatic external defibrillation (AED) training.

Recertification every 3 years.

FIRST AID/CPR/AED RECERTIFICATION

The goal of this re-certification is to allow students as much practical exercise as possible, while meeting the growing demand for oneday re-certification format. This is the standard First Aid & CPR 'A' recertification course. Automated External Defibrillator (AED) recertification is included.

Recertification every 3 years.

GROUND DISTURBANCE FOR SUPERVISORS AND WORKERS (SOUTHEAST COLLEGE) - 1 DAY

One day program is designed for anyone that is supervising a Ground Disturbance (GD), including performing an independent Ground Disturbance or issuing and/or receiving GD permits. This program ensures all supervisory personnel and workers have the training and understanding in all regulations involved in a GD. This course is certified to Alberta Common Ground Alliance (ABCGA) 201 Standard.

Recertification every 3 years.

H2S ALIVE (ENERGY SAFETY CANADA) - 1 DAY

Students will learn how to work safely in and around hydrogen sulphide (H2S) environments and receive a 3 year certificate in a one day class. Course should be taken by all workers in the petroleum industry who could be exposed to hydrogen sulphide H2S.

Recertification every 3 years.

H2S BLENDED RENEWAL

Students must pre-register with Energy Safety Canada for the online/ interactive portion of the renewal prior to registering with Southeast College.

Recertification every 3 years.

POWERED MOBILE EQUIPMENT (PME) TRAINING (SOUTHEAST COLLEGE)

Must be 16 years of age with driver's licence.

Covers theories of equipment operation, government regulations, and safe operating practices. Includes hands-on training and evaluation. Southeast College is equipped to train in the following PME areas: Aerial Boom lift/Boom Articulation, Backhoe, Bucket Truck, Crawler, Excavator, Forklift, Front End Loader, Grader, Ice Resurfacing, Rough Terrain Fork/Zoom Boom, Scissor Lift, Skid Steer, Tractor. Contact us if you are in need of any PME training not listed above.

Recertification is required in 3 years and also requires recertification if the equipment changes within those 3 years.

RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES - ONLINE

Your Path to a Safe Workplace (R&R) program was developed for the Saskatchewan workplace and takes workers and management employees through the fundamentals of the Saskatchewan Occupational Health & Safety Act as well as the internal responsibility system.

SAFETY ESSENTIALS (SOUTHEAST COLLEGE) - LENGTH IS CUSTOMIZABLE

A customizable safety training package tailored to meet your organization's specific needs.

SPECIAL OILFIELD BOILER OPERATOR (SOUTHEAST COLLEGE) - 5 DAYS

This course is intended to assist candidates in their preparation for writing a provincial Oilfield Operators Part B exam.

TRANSPORTATION OF DANGEROUS GOODS

To ensure the safety of drivers, the public and the environment the TDG Act and its regulations are in place to govern: The handling of dangerous goods; The offering of dangerous goods to a carrier for transportation; The transportation of dangerous goods.

This course is available online or in person through Southeast College. Recertification every 3 years.

WHMIS

This program covers the basics of Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS), providing workers with general knowledge and skills to work safely around hazardous materials. It covers worker education, workplace labelling and material safety data sheets (MSDS).

Recertification annually.

Note: WHMIS is implemented through coordinated federal, provincial and territorial legislation. Supplier labelling and MSDS requirements are set out under the "Hazardous Products Act (HPA)" and associated "Controlled Products Regulations". The "Hazardous Products Act" and its regulations are administered by the Government of Canada Department of Health, commonly referred to as Health Canada.


